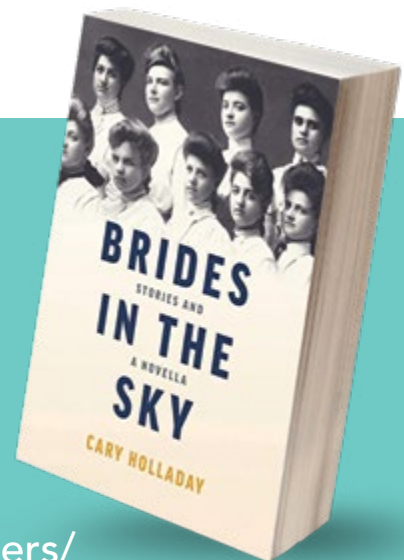
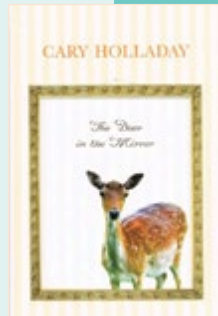
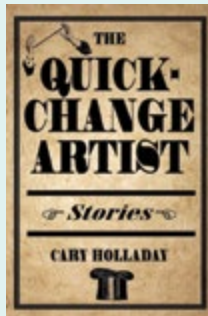
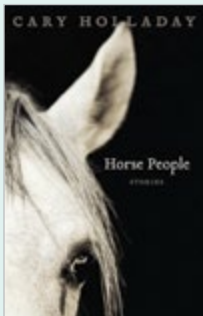
She has received numerous fellowships and awards, including an O. Henry Prize for "Merry-Go-Sorry," a story about the West Memphis Three.
